Expectations

What is PBS?

Positive Behavior Support is a proactive approach to discipline that includes the prevention of undesirable behaviors by using a program that actively teaches and reinforces appropriate skills and behaviors.

PBS uses a simple set of behavioral expectations in order to positively change discipline outcomes. The three positive behavior expectations chosen by CMS are respectful, responsible, and reliable.



How can a parent/guardian of a Cuba Middle School child demonstrate our school-wide expectations?



Respectful

- ◆ Use appropriate language and tone in the building
- ◆ Try to schedule your child's appointments and vacations during breaks
- ◆ Use appropriate communications channels to address a problem
- ◆ Schedule appointments to meet with teachers during non-instructional times.



Responsible

- ◆ Call the school to report an absence
- ◆ Know your child's teachers and friends
- ◆ Keep up with your child's assignment and homework
- ◆ Notify the school of any changes in behavior
- ◆ Communicate any concerns to the administrators, counselor or teachers
- ◆ Make sure your child has good attendance and arrives on time
- ◆ Enforce the dress code
- ◆ Discuss the school-wide expectations with your child



Reliable

- ◆ Inform nurse of any medication changes or illnesses
- ◆ Drop off and pick up children in an area free from moving cars and busses
- ◆ Allow a child with a temperature above 100 degrees to rest at home
- ◆ Give the school your emergency phone numbers and update information as it changes
- ◆ Know your child's after school transportation plans
- ◆ Make sure your child is bringing appropriate items to school
